Background

- WIOA (Workforce Innovation Opportunity Act) regulations signed into federal law July 1, 2014.
- WIOA is federal law under US Department of Labor/Employment and Training Administration (ETA)
- New requirements on board representation of organizations representing the workforce such as apprenticeships, unions, groups that alleviate worker barriers, etc.
- Chambers of Commerce and industry associations now qualify as Private-Sector
- Eliminates previous requirements for committees, but specifies specific functions WDBs must address through new committee structures
- Identify WDB membership recruitment that aligns with strategic priorities and sectors
